SHORT BIO

Michael Christopher Brown (MCB) is a photographer, filmmaker and the author of *Libyan Sugar* and *Yo Soy Fidel*. He became known for his pioneering use of the phone camera as a primary reporting device in conflict zones, including during the Libyan Revolution. This documentation led to the seminal book *Libyan Sugar*, which won the Paris Photo / Aperture First PhotoBook Award and the ICP Infinity Award for Artist's Book. A former associate photographer at Magnum Photos, MCB has been a photographer at National Geographic Magazine since 2004. The main character of and a cinematographer for Michael Mann's HBO documentary *Witness: Libya*, his work was also featured in several other conflict based documentaries including *Hondros*, *Which*

way is the Front Line from Here? The Life and Time of Tim Hetherington, The Prosecutors, and This is Congo. In 2023, MCB released the novel and controversial AI reportage illlustration work 90 Miles. He lives in Los Angeles with his five year old daughter, Poppy.
